## Difference, Danger, Discrimination

#### Labeling

Assigning an attribute to a person, place, thing or event (e.g., HIV = "gay disease"; HIV/AIDS = "death")

#### Stereotyping

Belief (primarily negative) about a group (e.g., "All men who have sex with men have HIV.")

#### Stigma

#### **Prejudice**

Agreement with a belief and/or negative emotional reaction (e.g., fear, anger)

#### Discrimination

Behaviors or actions that are in agreement with a belief or negative emotional response defended or encouraged by society (e.g., avoidance, withhold employment and housing opportunities, withhold help, fails to pursue work and housing opportunities)
